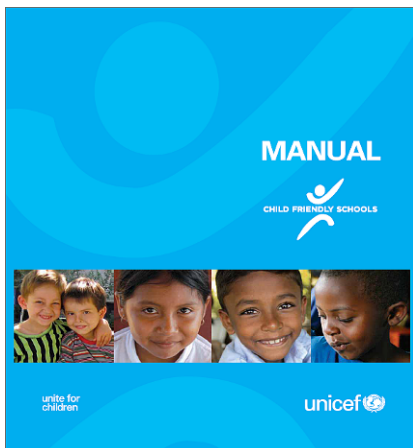


- **Podcast Series on Education in Emergencies and Post-Crisis Transition Countries**
