

### The following regulations shall apply:

- All students shall take and pass all registered courses offered by TIE in collaboration with the relevant departments at OUT Faculty of Education.
- The minimum pass grade shall be “B”.
- A student who fails some courses but attains a GPA of at least 2.7 (out of 5.0) shall be allowed to complete supplementary assignments based on the failed course.
- A student who fails to attain a GPA of 2.7 shall be discontinued.

## POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN CURRICULUM DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT

The Postgraduate Diploma in Curriculum Design and Development is a programme offered by Tanzania Institute of Education (TIE), the Open University of Tanzania (OUT), and UNESCO (IBE, BRED, IICBA, PDE/TED). It is accredited by Tanzania Commission for Universities (TCU).

### Admission requirements

- Candidates should have at least a first degree in education (B.Ed, B.A.Ed or B.Sc.Ed) or PGDE, and teaching experience of at least 3 years.
- The minimum pass level should be lower second class with GPA of at least 3.0.
- Recent graduates will only be considered if they have at least 5 years in previous teaching experience.
- Candidates must be able to attend the initial face-to-face intensive session
- Candidates must have internet access to participate in the online sessions



### Teaching staff

The professors, lecturers, and experts in education and curriculum are from institutions and universities from Tanzania, East Africa, other regions around the world, and UNESCO.

### Facilities

The seminar rooms are equipped with computers and wireless internet connection for easy access to online study materials.



### Mode of Delivery

The course is offered on a part-time basis, including a compulsory face-to-face intensive session for two weeks (10 days of 8 hours each) immediately before the online phase begins.

### Face-to-face session

This session includes lectures, hands on activities, and school visits over two weeks. Students take the lead in the learning process and work dynamically in teams. Orientation for the programme and the online platform is conducted during this time.

### Online phase

After the face-to-face session, courses are delivered through distance learning over 30 weeks. A five-week period is allocated to each module, with assignments through papers, case study reviews, and forums. Tutors provide guidance, feedback, and support.

### Learning materials

Participants receive the IBE Curriculum Resource Pack containing conceptual frameworks, training activities, and case studies from different regions. Supplementary resources and a reader are also provided.

### Language of instruction

Training materials and sessions will be delivered in English, French, and facilitated for Lusophone participants.

### Timeframe

The Diploma will start on December 2, 2013 and take place over the academic year 2013-2014.
